Let's Eat!

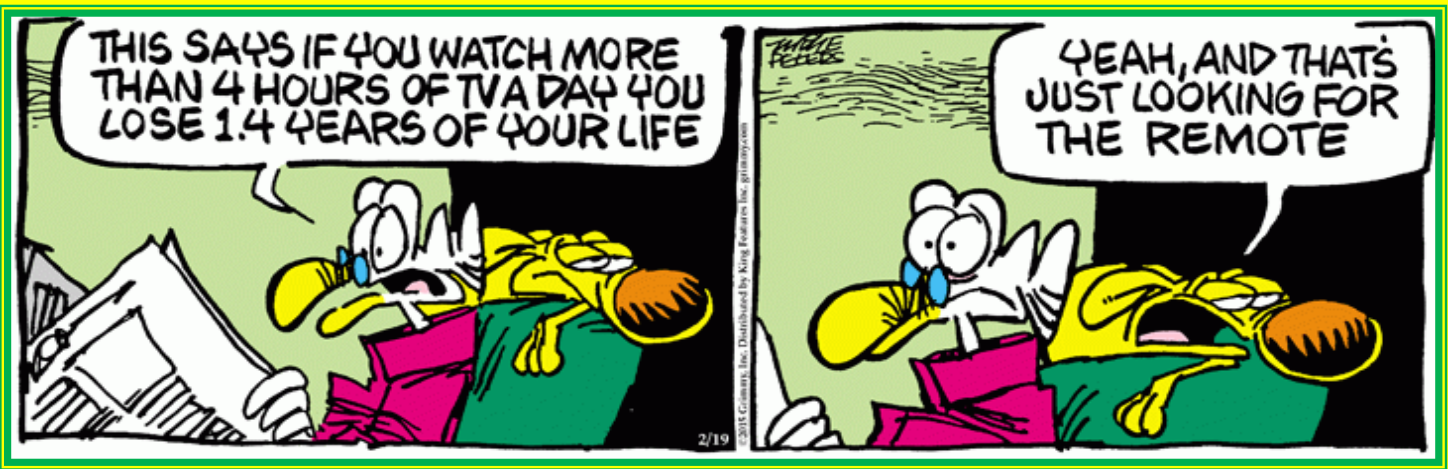
- Dough for single-crust pie (RECIPE BELOW)
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 tablespoons plus 1-1/2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 1 cup whole milk
- 1/2 cup lemon juice
- 3 large egg yolks, lightly beaten
- 1/4 cup butter, cubed
- 1 tablespoon grated lemon zest
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream, whipped



Dough for single-crust pie: Combine 1-1/4 cups all-purpose flour and 1/4 tsp. salt; cut in 1/2 cup cold butter until crumbly. Gradually add 3-5 Tbsp. ice water, tossing with a fork until dough holds together when pressed. Shape into a disk; wrap and refrigerate 1 hour. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough to a 1/8-in.-thick circle; transfer to a 9-in. pie plate. Trim to 1/2 in. beyond rim of plate; flute edge. Refrigerate 30 minutes. Preheat oven to 425°. Line crust with a double thickness of foil. Fill with pie weights, dried beans or uncooked rice. Bake on a lower oven rack until edge is golden brown, 20-25 minutes. Remove foil and weights; bake until bottom is golden brown, 3-6 minutes longer. Cool on a wire rack.

Lemon Custard: In a large heavy saucepan, mix sugar and cornstarch. Whisk in milk and lemon juice until smooth. Cook and stir over medium-high heat until thickened and bubbly. Reduce heat to low; cook and stir 2 minutes longer. Remove from heat. In a small bowl, whisk a small amount of hot mixture into egg yolks; return all to the pan, whisking constantly. Bring to a gentle boil; cook and stir 2 minutes. Remove from heat. Stir in butter and lemon zest. Cool without stirring. Stir in sour cream. Add filling to crust. Top with whipped cream. Chill 4-6 hours before serving. Yield: 6-8 servings.

What Will They Think Of Next?

The KitchenAid Mixer

With May being the month for “Mother’s Day”, let’s look at an item that a lot of mothers would love to get as a gift....a KitchenAid Mixer. It’s the most popular mixer currently on the market and is the mixer of choice of many professional chefs. Julia Child, the famous authority on French cooking, once stated that KitchenAid mixers made mixing “marvelous”.

In 2019, KitchenAid celebrated its 100th birthday. Yet, before reaching that milestone, it had a history. That legendary stand mixer got its start in 1908 when Herbert Johnston, a Hobart engineer and one of the company’s founders, was watching a baker mixing dough by hand and believed there was a better way to mechanically perform that tiresome task. The Hobart Manufacturing Company, based out of Troy, Ohio, developed an 80-quart stand mixer designed for professional bakeries. It was a hit with commercial bakeries because it had the capacity to mix, fold and beat large quantities of batter and dough. The U.S. Navy took an interest in the mixer, and by 1917, it had become standard equipment on all ships. In 1918, the company decided to develop a smaller-scale mixer for the common household. The new appliance was tested among local housewives and was so well liked, one housewife exclaimed “I don’t care what you call it, it’s the best kitchen aid I’ve ever had.” Hence, the trademark “KitchenAid” came into existence!

The company’s first mixer, the C-10, was the first KitchenAid mixer designed for home use and Hobart was ready to put them in department stores, However, stores were reluctant to carry the line. In response to that, Hobart hired a largely female sales force to sell the C-10 door to door. KitchenAid became a division of Hobart, and in 1922, it introduced a new 5-quart mixer that better fit the needs of the home kitchen. It sold for a substantial sum: \$189.50 (equal to more than \$2,800 today). A newer, lighter weight mixer was launched in 1928, which appealed more to housewives. The company made itself known in the marketplace, but faced stiff competition from other brands, including the Sunbeam Mixmaster. The Mixmaster was the most popular stand mixer from the 1930’s through the 1950’s. KitchenAid made a quality product, but the company felt that its mechanical appearance needed to be more “eye catching”. In 1937, a new, lower priced model was created, the streamlined “K model”, which has become the gold standard for the brand. With its sleek, enameled appearance, this more modern mixer was instantly popular and helped KitchenAid to eventually take the top spot in sales.

The mixer really proved its popularity during the 2020 COVID pandemic. With most of America shut down, many families took advantage of the downtime to do new things with their children to pass the time. Cooking and baking became a very popular activity and this caused sales of the KitchenAid mixer to soar...that is, until the KitchenAid plants were forced to shut down at the peak of the pandemic. KitchenAid’s manufacturing plants were closed for three weeks, putting the company behind in meeting the demand for mixers. Department stores ran out of the mixers and for a time, they were virtually impossible to find. Once the plants reopened, the company worked like mad to catch up with the demand for their mixers. Numerous models of KitchenAid mixers have come and gone over the years, but the “Model K” design has remained popular. The mixer line now includes a “KitchenAid Mini”, which is 25% smaller compared to their popular classic model, as well as Professional and portable models. Available in a huge array of colors, there’s a mixer for all cooks according to budget, space, and cooking skill. ***FUN FACT: JULIA CHILD OWNED A BLUE KITCHENAID MIXER, WHICH WAS DONATED TO THE SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTE ALONG WITH HER HOME KITCHEN FROM CAMBRIDGE, MASSACHUSETTS.***
